- Additional Revision List, 1883, and Revision List text files, 18501858, Kremenets-district towns: We are gradually adding in translations of
 corrections and additions to the Russian Revision Lists (censuses) made
 after the original collections. Check the master Revision List file (on
 the Contributor website) or the Concordance for your family names.
- <u>Testimony of Bronia (Walberg) Spielvogel, Born in Krzemieniec, Poland,</u>
 1917: This testimony collected by Yad Vashem describes her experiences in the Krzemieniec Ghetto and in hiding. Thanks for Batya Cohen for her translation from Hebrew.
- Murder of Yoel Shoimer and family, May 1942; death of Red Army soldier
 Mikhail Shoimer, 1945: Translation from Russian of official documentation of these events
- Pages of Testimony (Russian), Kremenets-district towns: We have completed translation of the final 160 Pages of Testimony submitted to Yad Vashem in Russian for people from Kremenets-district towns. In all, we have extracted information from 8,641 Pages in English, French, Hebrew, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, and Yiddish.

- Kol Yotsei Kremenits, Booklets 8-10, Yiddish sections (with others to come soon): From 1967 to 1982, Kremenets (and, from 1979 on, Shumsk) emigrants in Israel published and circulated 18 booklets containing reminiscences of their towns and news about their community, with contributions from emigrants in Argentina, Canada, and the United States. The Hebrew sections of the booklets have been translated, and the Yiddish sections are in progress, thanks to translator Ted Steinberg.
