- Kol Yotsei Kremenits, Booklets 11-14, Yiddish sections: From 1967 to 1982, Kremenets (and, from 1979 on, Shumsk) emigrants in Israel published and circulated 18 booklets containing reminiscences of their towns and news about their community, with contributions from emigrants in Argentina, Canada, and the United States. The Hebrew sections of the

- booklets have been translated, and the Yiddish sections will soon be complete, thanks to translator Ted Steinberg.
- <u>Testimony of Fania Marbak, born Wisniowiec, Poland, 1922</u> (PDF): This translation of her testimony submitted to Yad Vashem details her experiences during World War II. Thanks to Batya Cohen for her translation.
- Polish Aliyah Passports, 1933-1948: This Excel spreadsheet (updated recently by Enid Cherenson) includes information from 28 Polish passports issued to Jews from Kremenets-district towns for immigration to British Mandate Palestine. The full database is searchable through Centralna Biblioteka Judaistyczna (Central Jewish Library), the online center of the Emanuel Ringelblum Jewish Historical Institute, Warsaw, Poland.
