All 19 Kol Yotsei Kremenits Booklets Now Translated

From 1967 to 1982, with an additional booklet in 1995, Kremenets (and, from 1979 on, Shumsk) emigrants in Israel published and circulated 19 booklets in Hebrew and Yiddish. The booklets containes reminiscences of their towns and news about their communities. Contributions also came from emigrants in Argentina, Canada, and the United States. The Hebrew sections were translated into English some years ago. We are happy to announce that we have completed translation of the all the Yiddish sections as well.

Hyperlinks to Original Images Added to Vital Records and Revision List Translation Files

<u>FamilySearch</u> has posted images for the 1870-1907 birth, marriage, divorce, and death records for Kremenets. In our master vital records translation spreadsheets, we have added links to the individual pages for these images. In addition, to our Revision List Master file, we have added links to the original images for all the

records we have translated. These records list the members of families at various intervals over the years 1811-1883 in the towns of Belozirka, Berezhtsy, Katerburg, Kremenets, Lanovtsy, Oleksinets, Pochayev, Podberezhtsy, Radzivilov, Rokhmanov, Shumsk, Vishnevets, Vyshgorodok, and Yampol; records for Kozin and Krupets cover the years 1850 and 1858. Most images are at FamilySearch, and a few are available thanks to Alex Krakovsky's efforts to scan records at the Ukraine archives.

The vital records and Revision List translation files are available on our <u>Contributor Site</u>, open to all who have donated cash, services, or materials over the past two years. All the names and towns in these resources are searchable in the <u>Concordance</u> (our master index). The Concordance now includes more than 500,000 entries.
