Welcome to the Bensman Family Website by Allen B. Saxe

My approach to family history began with the idea of engaging the entire family in learning with me. I constantly posed questions, requested stories and photographs. JewishGen became an invaluable resource for connecting me to other researchers. I was also fortunate to reconnect with an old high school friend, Joel Alpert, who created a website of the Jews of Sheboygan, Wisconsin. I was able to locate some researchers in Belarus who gained access to records that enabled me to learn about the early history of our family. While I knew the broad history of my great-grandparents, my research pushed our history back generations.

Dr. Tsodik Aronin (who came to the US in the 1980's), the grandson of my grandfather's sister Devorah, learned of my research. Tanya Ozadovsky (who lives in Moscow), the granddaughter of my grandfather's sister Reyla, found me. Tanya and her son Jacob were able to provide the most amazing story of the survival my grandfather's five siblings and their families who all remained in Belarus. My grandfather Yehuda and his four brothers (Joseph, Abe, William, and Max) arrived in the US, along with Meyer's son, cousin Leo, in the early 1900's. Meyer, Zalman, Reyla, Devorah, and Itka remained in Belarus. They survived WWI and WWII.

As I was documenting our branch of the Bensman family, more and more Bensmans began contacting me. I grew up knowing my first and second

cousins, but now I have documented third cousins and even sixth and seventh cousins. There are still numerous branches that I still have not connected, but I hope I will eventually learn more.

I do owe a deep appreciation to several people who have encouraged and assisted me throughout the past decade. Stephen Bensman, my second cousin, and his wife Miriam are both outstanding intellects who have always made their time available to translate Russian, Yiddish, Polish documents. My first cousin Rhoda and her husband Phil were active researchers. My cousin Rhoda knew the family stories and always had great insight. Tanya Ozadovsky's documentation of the family in Belarus, Russia, Israel, and many other places has been remarkable. Evelyn Bensman Rudnick,the daughter of William Bensman, has been a major source of family history and provided many of the wonderful photographs.

Our earliest documented direct ancestor was Borukh Bensman. Borukh had three sons, Leyba, Zalman, and Abram-Meyer. While we do not have Borukh's date of birth, he probably was born in the late 1700's.

Abram-Meyer was born in 1800 and is our next documented direct ancestor. His wife was Ginda Leybova. They had a daughter Lifsha and four sons, Itska, Yankel, Zalman and Borukh. Abram-Meyer was approved by the civil authorities to be a farmer. This occurred in 1853, and it literally took an "act of Congress."

Dossier on the land buy from the landlord of Lepel Uezd Dobrovolsky according to the petition of Lepel petty bourgeois Abram-Meyer Borukhovich Bensman, 1853-1854, where following was noticed:

In June 1853 Abram-Mejer Bensman applied with the petition on his wish to do a farming with his family to the Civil Gubernator of Vitebsk Province, wherefore he has bought 23 dessiatina and 1800 sagen of ploughland from the landlord Dobrovolsky at the folvark Plotki of Lepel Uezd. A kupchaya krepost was made at the Court of Lepel Uezd in 1853 April 14. He also informed about the land buy from his own funds in the petition. He submitted a document from Lepel Municipal Duma, 1853 May 11, where noticed that there were no barriers for his including into the class of jews-farmers.

Zalman was born in 1822. Abram-Meyer's son Zalman was allowed to continue as a farmer. This gave the family certain privileges and an exemption from military service which continued until 1880. Zalman was the father of David Bensman (my great grandfather).

March 4, the Civil Gubernator of Vitebsk Province was informed about Abram Bensman's including into the class of the jews-farmers by Vitebsk Kazyennaya Palata. 1854 November 3, "Vitebsk Provincial Committee for jews-farmers" was informed that Jankel Abramov B. and Zalman Abramov B., jews, have been included into the Abram-Mejer Bensman father's family from the beginning of 1855 by Vitebsk Kazyennaya Palata. They have been allowed "to use a privilege on a par with the father....beginning this privilege from the time of his including into the farmers, i.e. from 1854: he had a tax privilege and exempted from other duties for 10 years, from recruitment duty for 25 years".

Fund 2552, opis 1, dyelo 88, pages 5-5ds, 8-8ds, 33-34, 39-40

It appears that these privileges ended in 1879 when our greatgrandfather David was starting his family of 10! In 1889, when we learn that David Bensman now lives outside of Lepel in his own house and is a brick maker

List of jews, who lived in the country of Lepel Uezd, 1889, where following persons were noticed: #163 Lepel petty bourgeois Bensman Dovid Zalmanov, lives in the village Staroye Lyadno of Zabolotskaja Volost, department to state property. He settled down there in 1875 November 3. He lives in the own house; the previous place of living was Lepel Town. He works as a worker at the brick-field. He has not any certificate from Manufacturing Board. He has 49 years old in 1889.

His wife Feyga Itskova, 46 years old.

His sons: Meyer, 20 years old;

Zalman, 14 years old; Yuda, 12 years old; Vulf, 10 years old; Abel, 7 years old; Ovsey, 6 years old; Mota, 2 years old.

His daughters: Itka, 18 years old;

Dvora, 16 years old; Relya, 4 years old.

Over the next decade Yehuda, Joseph, William, Abe and Max would emigrate to the US.

Bensman

Meyer was the oldest child. He was the teacher (malamed). He had four sons (Isaac, Leo, Zalman and Borukh) and a daughter – Pesya. Leo and Pesya were twins. Leo had departed with his uncles to USA. He never married, but he had tried to support his sisters and brothers in Belarus by sending them presents. He lived in Duluth, Minnesota and owned a men's store. He was a major contributor to Jewish institutions in Duluth. Isaak and Pesya lived and died in the town of Novo-Borisov which is not far from Minsk, the capital of Belarus. They were rather old. Isaak had two sons: David and Abram. David lives in the Ukraine. He has a son and a daughter. Abram lives in Alma-Ata, Kazahkstan; he has a son and a daughter too.

Peysa (Bensman-Gurvich) had four daughters (Fanya,Fruma,Zina and Brocha) and a son Jury who tragically died at his work. His son Eugen no lives in Minsk. Fanya had died in the age of 60. Her daughter Tamara lives in Minsk with her family, her son Sasha (Shablya) lives in Israel. Fruma lives in Israel with her daughters and grandchildren. Zina and Broha live near Rochester,NYwith their children and grandchildren.

Zalman lived in Minsk and then in Moscow. He died in 1995. He was 95. He was an accountant general. He was at WW2 and had some decorations. He has a son Abram who lives in Germany now with one of his daughter Ira and grand children. Abram's daughter Galya lives in Israel with her family.

Borukh lived in Moscow. He was an engineer. He died in 1988. He was 86. He served in WW2 and had some decorations. He had two sons. One of them – Albert lives in Moscow. He is an engineer. He is 70 years old. His son Igor is the musician and has two daughters: Darya and Tanya. Albert has also a daughter Ann.

Another son of Borukh-Mark now lives in Israel. His elder son Roman lives in USA with his family and the younger son of Mark named Albert lives in Israel. They all are highly educated. (Contributed by Tanya Ozadovsky)




the great grandson of Borukh of Belarus, the great grandson of Meyer Bensman of Belarus is blessed with a tradition of learning, love of family and tzedekah.



Zalman was the second son of David and Feiga. He lived in Lepel with his family – two sons (Isaac and Joseph) and four daughters (Ida, Feiga, Sonya and Fruma).

Zalman was evacuated by his daughter Feiga from Lepel when WW2 began, so he was saved. After WW2 he lived with the family of his son Isaak in Leningrad. The eldest son of Zalman was Isaak who was born in 1905. He came to Leningrad from Lepel, He graduated from the Institute and then lived and worked there all his life even when Leningrad was blockaded in WW2. He was clever and successful.

He had two sons: Vladimir and Gregory. Vladimir died, and did not have children. Gregory has a son and a daughter. The son lives in Leningrad now, the daughter lives in Germany. They all are highly educated, have family and children.

The second son of Zalman was Joseph. He graduated from the Leningrad University, he was the chemist. Then he was sent to Klin (it is not far from Tver), where he lived all his life with his family. He served in WW2 and has some decorations. He was born in 1907 and died in 1972. Joseph had two sons: Jury and Igor. Jury is an English teacher. He lives in Moscow and has a daughter Elena and

grandson Misha. Igor is the worker. He lives in Kiln with his family and has one daughter Vera.

The eldest daughter of Zalman was Ida. She was born in 1903 and was the first of Zalman*s children who went from Lepel to Leningrad to study. She became a teacher of history and lived in Leningrad for all her life. She died when she was 82 years old.

Ida had a daughter and a son. The daughter was named Dina (Rascazova). She was born in 1930 and was the teacher of German. She lived in Leningrad and died in 1974. She had no children. Ida's son Gennady (Rascazov) was born in 1936. He was an engineer, lived in Leningrad and died at 56. Gennady had a daughter Elen, who lives in Leningrad and has two sons Max and Roman.

The second daughter of Zalman was named Feiga. She had no education and did not have her own family, but she was the woman who was always ready to help her relatives: she helped her father with evacuation (their mother had already died). She helped raise all her nephews and nieces. She appeared where she was needed most of all. She was born in 1910 and died in 1987. She lived in Lepel and Leningrad until WW2 began and then she lived in Moscow.

The third daughter of Zalman was Sonya. She also went to Leningrad to study, graduated from the Institute (diploma with Honor) and become a chemist-engineer. She married her cousin David Mazo, who was son of Relya, the daughter of David and Faiga Bensman. They lived not far Moscow. Sonya was born in 1912 and died in 1989. She had one daughter Tanya and one grandson Jacob (Ozadovsky). They live in Moscow and are highly educated.

The youngest daughter of Zalman was Fruma. She studied in Leningrad and became a medical nurse. Her husband (Ivan Kulikov) was in the military, he served in WW2 and after war was sent to serve in Ukraine. So Fruma lived there. They had two daughters and a son: Lusya, Galina and Vladimir. Fruma was born in 1917 and died in 1983. Lusya (Morozova) lives now in St. Petersburg and has one son Sergey. Galina (Stolina) lives in Moscow, has a son and a granddaughter Alla. Vladimir lives in Ucraina in Chernovtsy, has one son Roman, who has a green-card and now work in USA. Galina, Vladimir and their children are highly educated.(Contributed by Tanya Ozadovsky)








Louis (Yehuda) Bensman was born in Lepel, Belarus. He and his brothers Joseph, Abe, William settled in Sheboygan in the early 1900's. Another brother Max lived in New York. Rieshe Sussman Bensman's sister's family (the Katchkeys) also settled in Sheboygan.

The photograph above, taken in 1924, shows Louis and Rieshe with their 10 children. Louis and Rieshe lived in Sheboygan from 1902 till 1921, when they moved to Two Rivers, Wisconsin. Louis returned to Sheboygan in 1950 and bought back his house there.

Most of Louis and Rieshe's children (Solomon, Jessie, David, Johnnie, Albert, and Ida) settled and raised their families in Milwaukee. Frieda raised her family in Fond du Lac and Joseph raised his in New York. The 10 children of Louis and Rieshe had much smaller families than their parents.

Joseph Bensman was the youngest son of Louis (Yehuda Bensman). In the article below he recounts his memories of his father.

THE SOCIOLOGIST ON THE CUTTING EDGE

I'm the son of a shoemaker who spent sixty years in middle America, never really learning English but conducting his business exclusively with a non-Jewish clientele by communicating with an idiosyncratic assortment of words and gestures. He came to New York in 1900, worked a year in garment shops, had some landsleit (immigrants from the same community) in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, saved enough money to move there, and then became a peddler. He traveled in the outskirts of Sheboygan, selling and sometimes exchanging fruit for junk. He came to Two Rivers (where I was born in 1922) and discovered a town with no shoemaker! He went back to Sheboygan and bought shoemaking equipment. The salesman ostensibly taught him how to repair shoes. He could be called a religious man who, however, worked on Saturdays and drove to Sheboygan for the holidays. He existed in spite (or because) of almost no contact with the town, a man who got along with his customers but, underneath, harbored real resentment against "beer-drinking and time-wasting goyim"

I was the youngest of ten children living in a house my father would not relinquish in the thirties so that we could qualify for relief like most of our neighbors. He wanted the welfare, but evidently wanted even more to keep the house. When I first wandered beyond its immediate confines, and at least through high school, I continuously experienced anti-Semitism in ways that I suspect the New Yorker can't imagine. I had no supporting group for me in my Jewishness. So I was a kike and a Christ-killer. My nickname was Yosky - their distortion of Yascha - which my mother called me. From four through twelve I belonged to delinquent gangs whose activity ranged from raiding gardens to breaking and entering railroad cars and stealing aluminum and other metals. At one point we were as close to the reformatory as you can get without actually being thrown into one. Yet I was always marginal, never wholly accepted, in but not of the group. I was the gang's "intellectual." If they needed me to figure out a way of planning a break-in, I was good for that.

I lived in a working-class neighborhood. In school I met middle-class kids. My brothers and sisters taught me how to read before I went to school, and from kindergarten on, my nose was always in a book. There was no cultural or educational tradition in the family, except the notion that if I turned out to be pretty smart they'd shep nachas (gain prestige) from it. But my bookishness did not exactly endear me to the neighborhood kids. I remember one stealing my hat and then beating the hell out of me because I was a lousy kike. At least that was the reason he gave. In one case around 1937, my assailant was a German kid. One of the parents of my best friend was a Bohemian who, whenever he got drunk, would call me a Christ-killer. I surely knew that I was Jewish.

I went to cheder for a while but did not get bar mitzvahed. Attending the cheder cost fifty cents a day-and in my eleventh year we couldn't afford that sum. The family lived on fish and potatoes. Two Rivers was a fishing town, and we grew our own potatoes.

I kept reading away, cultivating my father's kind of resentment, which I directed at middle-class kids who comprised the gangs our gang fought. Within a working-class gang one developed class consciousness, particularly in the form of hostility toward well-mannered snobs. I suppose I always resented kids whose stock-in-trade was manners, poise, and a feeling that they owned the world. From the age of four on, I knew I was smarter than most of those kids; but I simply could not discover a sensible basis for their self-confidence, the poise and the manners which allowed them to think they could push everyone else around. I must have been thirty-five before I realized that they were just as nutty as I was, but covered themselves with a facade of manners I had not been able to penetrate.

By the time I reached seventh grade, I was half-mockingly called "the professor" by my classmates. Since I had emerged from a lower-class environment, I became a hero of working-class kids. I could put down the middle and upper class just by virtue of my vocabulary. In eighth grade, I had committed the minor offense of throwing a pen at a pupil's foot and missing it by half an inch. The teacher was so shocked at this that she made me memorize the Constitution. As a result, I recited the Preamble in class and thus became a boy orator. This thrust me into a political and social science tradition I had not previously known to exist. I went

out for debate and for extemporary speaking which made me a big macher (big shot) in the high school. I depleted the city and the school libraries. Their books enchanted me much more than homework. I did well, I think, as an act of defiance against the system.

When I became a boy orator my picture began appearing in the local press, and with that I got hints of recognition at home. The pattern of my family, and it's my pattern also, was never to let the other person know that you're impressed. So I was teased and put down for my accomplishments, but even in that act I recognized that they were praising me.

I learned at an early age that my father had a brilliant mind with absolutely no possibility of using it in his American ambience. He was far more original than any of the teachers I had. Once when we were debating the issue of unicameral legislatures in state government, he asked me about it. It was clear that he didn't know these words. I spent twenty minutes telling him what we were debating.. It was totally outside his own experience. Just the same, in his broken amalgam of languages, he remarked, "Well, when you got legislators in two houses of different size, in the large one you can get local interests represented that you couldn't get in the small one." Now that was brilliant. We had batted this problem around for six months and in minutes he presented, a stronger case than any of us could formulate.

But my father's greatest influence on me consisted of his resentment of the stuffed shirts and middle-class "respectables." On one memorable occasion he talked about a peddler who was the cantor, the most religious man in shul. This peddler had a son who owned the local pool hall. He described the son as a typical greenhorn: a man with a five-cent cigar, knife-edged pressed pants, shined shoes, holes in the toes of socks, and dirty underwear. His total image of society lay in that description. He was sure that anybody who made two thousand dollars more than he did had to be a gonif (thief). I think I internalized his whole attitude, and that it's as good a basis for sociology as any.

My father was an honest artisan. His ambition for me was to be a tailor and to earn a respectable living in the local tailoring shop. Of course I had no interest in it. I was a high-flying debater, who had been reading at such a high level that what to do next was altogether unclear.

While I was a senior in high school, I thought I might become a village freak, the kind of small town intellectual at whom everyone else laughs and jeers. That year, I joined the community discussion club. We were then debating the third term for Franklin Roosevelt. I was pitted against the Vice President of Hamilton Manufacturing Company-the Vice President of Public Relations-a very smooth guy who made all the firm's speeches. Everyone there, bankers, lawyers, businessmen, thought that Roosevelt was either insane or a Communist. I was well prepared, making an innocent historical speech in which I concluded that Roosevelt had to be elected because he was antibusiness. In the question period I cited numbers, statistics, laws, legislation. I had more evidence than anyone present. To me it was exhilarating because here I was fighting the whole goddam establishment. Also, I knew that in the very act of winning, I was done for in Two Rivers. There were maybe half a dozen people there who, although they would not publicly support my argument, congratulated me after the meeting.

Joseph Bensman was born in Wisconsin in 1922. He is the author of several books in applied and humanistic sociology, among them Small Town in Mass Society (1960) with Arthur Vidich, and Dollars and Sense (1967). He was professor of sociology at City College and the Graduate Center of CUNY. Joseph Bensman died in 1986.



The foundations of that log cabin are still there, and my father showed them to me just before his death. Steinthal means "stone valley" in German, and that is the kind of land that is there. The Bensmans were farming rocks.

Joseph Bensman's children were Paul, Ben, Sol, Sylvia (Chickie), Emily and Dora.

Memories of My Grandfather: Joseph Bensman

By Stephen J. Bensman

The following is a memoir based upon conversations that I had with my grandfather, Joseph Bensman, during the mid-1960s when we talked together while I spending time in Sheboygan working on my dissertation for the doctorate in Russian history. I am contributing it to the Jewishgen Shtetlinks web pages for Sheboygan, Wisconsin and Lepel, Belorussia, because it contains valuable information on the life of the forbears of the Sheboygan Jews in Russia and on their early days in the United States.

One of the first things I ascertained from my grandfather was the precise location in Russia from where my family originated. I had always suspected that it was the town of Lepel', because family tradition had it that we came from "Leple" and in the locative case in Russian Lepel' becomes Leple. Thus, to say in Russian, "I live in Lepel", one says, "Ya zhivu v Leple." To ascertain this, I sat my grandfather down with a detailed map of the then Soviet Union and named the towns around Lepel'. It turned out that he knew all the towns around Lepel' for about 25 miles out and then did not know the small towns but did know the big ones like Vitebsk and Minsk.

I had further confirmation of this recently, when the assistant to the Slavic Bibliographer at the University of Wisconsin-Madison wrote me that the name Bensman is specific to the towns of Lepel' and Rechitsa according to the book by Alexander Beider (A Dictionary of Jewish Surnames from the Russian Empire, Teaneck, NJ, Avotaynu, 1993, p. 128-129). It is a Cohen name deriving from the Yiddish word "benchn" or "to bless" and meaning "one who blesses." Other forms of the name are Benchman and the Russified Bentsman.

I have translated Tsarist encyclopedia articles on Lepel', which are posted on the Web. If one reads them and this, one will see that the encyclopedia articles corroborate what my grandfather told me. These articles also confirm the family story that my great grandfather Aaron Holman emigrated to Sheboygan from "Leple" in the 1880s after losing 500 gold rubles on venture to float a log raft to market as such ventures were a common economic activity in the Lepel' region. On a visit to Israel I found out at the Tel Aviv Museum that the Germans declared the Lepel' region "Judenrein" (Clean of Jews) in 1942-43.

During our conversation, I questioned my grandfather very closely and managed to get a fairly good picture of the Bensmans in Lepel, Russia. They operated a brick kiln. They not only made bricks, but they knocked down houses to salvage bricks. In doing so, they always checked the wooden beams in the houses they destroyed to see if any money had been hidden in the rafters. This was common, since Lepel' lies on the main invasion routes, and people were always having to have to hide. Napoleon's Grand Army passed through Lepel'. The Bensmans burned the rafters to operate the kiln. However, the Bensmans could not make ends meet from just operating the kiln My grandfather had to do other work. Among the jobs he did were the following. First, he ran teams of horses to drag logs out of the forest during the cutting season in winter. Since he was smart, he managed to rig the chains, so that he could drag out two logs instead of the usual one log. A merchant would then buy the logs and smack his mark on it with a special hammer. Second, he farmed. Jews could not own land, so he rented land from the Lepel' municipal council. Third, he worked as a navvy in Vitebsk, digging foundations. Since he was Jewish, he was always given the task of digging where the latrines of former buildings had emptied. Finally, he was a mean horse trader. My grandfather's skill at horse trading was so well known, that when he was drafted in the Russian army, the intention was to assign him to the cavalry so he could buy and sell horses for it. As a general rule, Jews were not put into combat units but were assigned to the quartermaster corps, where their skills as traders, tinkers, tailors, cobblers, etc., were found very useful.

I showed my grandfather a Russian newspaper, and he commented that he had seen something like it once. It also brought to mind the local nobleman who had a bike, which amazed the peasants and caused them to laugh when he rode it. My grandfather did not even know his own birth date until the Russian Army told him it when he was summoned to service. My grandfather could speak some Russian heavily influenced by Polish as was common in Belarus, but he did not know the words for directions like north, south, east, west. These were

concepts entirely alien to him. He always oriented himself by what directions lay the major towns and cities, and even in the US he gave directions in these terms on where to go fishing. The Bensmans were not like the other Jews, for they were more integrated into the local gentile population than most other Jews. In Russia my grandfather was involved slightly with the Socialist Revolutionaries, who specialized in blowing up Tsarist officials. He told me that the Socialist Revolutionaries used to meet in secret on an island in one of the lakes of the Lepel' district.

My grandfather was a hard man tutored in a hard world. I saw him on his death bed: he was totally without fear. He told that once in Russia he drove an iron pole through his foot while breaking the ice to fish. All he did was to stuff moss in the foot and continue. From him I learned a lot about life among the common people in the Lepel' district. For example, once he told me a rural knee-slapper popular among the peasants of the Lepel' district. It was a joke about a peasant with a sick bull (byk, in Russian) sent to see a doctor named Bullov (Bykov) to get it cured. He also told me about a peasant who stole a horse in winter but stupidly left tracks in the snow so the other peasants could trace him. When they caught the thief, they beat him so badly that one of his eyes popped out. This story impressed me, because during my research for my dissertation on Russian liberals during the Revolution of 1905, I read a memoir describing how the police broke up a meeting, beating a man so badly that one of his eyes popped out, and I got the idea that this was a common thing in the Russia of this period. Moreover, he told me how due to a lack of fodder, the peasants used to house their cattle for the winter at the state vodka monopoly, where they were fed the mash used to make the vodka. The cattle were stoned for the entire winter, and a common entertainment was to watch the drunken beasts released in the spring and come stumbling out like a bunch of drunken bums. Moreover, my grandfather was an acute social observer, and he accurately described to me one of the causes leading to the Russian Revolution: how the population was growing in Lepel' and forcing the land to be divided among more and more people without an increase in farming technology, causing poverty and famine. Given his illiteracy, I was impressed with his astute observations. However, at times he had to break into Russian to explain things to me. For example, when he told me why he could not own land, he simply said, "Ya ne byl krest'yanin." This means "I was not a peasant," and the root for the Russian word peasant is "krest" or "cross", giving it the connotation of "a person of the cross", and a poor person had to a member of this social estate to belong to a household which could own land in the Lepel' district. You can see the complexity of what he was trying to say and why he just used the simple Russian phrase, hoping that I would catch his meaning.

My grandfather's decision to come to the US was motivated by his being drafted into the Russian Army in 1902. He was advised by his brother Max to stay out of the Army. Max knew the Russian Army, because he had served in it for 5 years. The thought of Max in the Russian Army caused my grandfather to laugh when he remembered how Max's "shinel" or "military great coat" was too big for him and how every time he sat down on it, his ass would hit the big buttons meant for the waist in the back, causing him to jump up. My grandfather and Max hatched a plan, by which my grandfather was to remain in the center of the column away from the guards at the front and back on the march which began at dawn from the reception depot to the Army, and then Max would drive a wagon of hay close to the column, so my grandfather could jump in. During the night at the reception depot, my grandfather met a member of the revolutionary intelligentsia and let him on the plan. Everything went according to plan, both my grandfather and the intelligent making their escape, and Max took my grandfather to the train station where he caught the train to Hamburg. At the border my grandfather asked a peasant woman with long skirts whether he could hide behind them under the seat so he could make it across to Germany. He told her that he was an Army deserter who would be shot if caught, and the woman agreed. This was the beginning of the Revolution of 1905, and the Army was combing the countryside with punitive detachments, so the danger was real. My grandfather made it to Hamburg and then to London, where many Jews from Lepel' district had established themselves. He worked for one of them, whom he knew through cheder, in a junk yard until he got enough money together. He then went down to the docks, where there were two ships-one for the US and one for Argentina. He flipped a coin, and the coin came down US, so I was able to be born.


My grandfather first settled on a farm in Steinthal, Wisconsin, with his brother William, raising dairy cattle. However, a dog they had came down with rabies and bit the cattle, which had to be destroyed. As a result of this, both my grandfather and my father had a passionate hatred of dogs. After the rabies incident, my grandfather moved to Sheboygan. There his wife Fannie started a grocery store in the front room of their house on 12th Street, while my grandfather peddled. Being good with horses under winter conditions, he used to take a sledge


full of goods to sell to the farmers, who in those days were snowed in and could not make it to town. The farmers would let him sleep at night in their barns. The grocery business prospered, and my grandfather built it up to around 9 small stores, in which he would put relatives or other Jews as managers. The Jews played an important role in the food business in Sheboygan due to my grandfather. The amazing thing was that he was able to do it without being able to add or subtract.


As an interesting aside, back in the 1920s my grandfather was approached by Chicago gangsters, who wanted to use his stores as warehouses for the liquor they were running down out of Canada. One of them offered my grandfather a huge wad of bills, but when he reached in to get the wad, he opened his coat so my grandfather could see the artillery he packing in his shoulder holster. My grandfather politely declined. Probably smart, because not only was there the danger of the police but also that a rival gang could come out of Chicago to wipe out their opponents' supply line. In another incident, according to my sister, bootleggers asked my grandfather to front for them in buying sugar, because a grocery business could buy the amount of sugar necessary to make illegal liquor without raising suspicions.

I will conclude these memories of my grandfather with a funny story told me by my father. Back in the 1920s my grandfather had a big problem with rats in the basement of one his stores. He tried poison, cats, and even a terrier, but nothing worked. The rats ignored the poison and killed the cats and the terrier. Finally, he was told about a fellow down in Milwaukee selling an animal called a mongoose that was deadly on rats. Having nothing to lose, my grandfather thought he try it, paying about \$200 for the mongoose, in those days about the price of a car. It worked like a charm; in a short time the mongoose killed off all the rats with no trouble. But one day my grandfather told one of his workers to go to the basement to get a case of canned goods. The worker went down, and there ensued a whooping and a hollering with the sounds of things being smashed and overturned. Finally, the worker came up from the basement with the mongoose by the tail in one hand and a shovel in the other, saying, "Biggest gottdamn rat I ever seen, but I managed to kill the damn thing anyway." My grandfather's response was, "Oi veh!"

They came from Lepel, Belarus in 1911 to Sheboygan. (They told their children, Lithuiania [they indeed were Litvaks])


Abraham and Mary had David (1913); Jean (1915); Israel (1916); and Rosie (1918). The family moved to Two Rivers, Wisconsin, where Abe worked in brother Louis Bensman's shoe store. They were shoemakers. They later seperated. Abe's mother, Mary, died 1937, the year their first grandson, Marvin (to David and Rose Swerdlow Bensman) was born. Rose and David had a daughter Laeh in 1943. Jeannie married David Horwitz (their children are Mary Lynn (named after Jean's mother), Michael, and Rachel); Israel married Ruth (Tootie) Berman (from Green Bay and their children are James, Kerry and Amy). and Rosie married C.J. Wyatt during WWII, a sailor. Rosie Bensman Wyatt had Richard, Karen and Jo Lynn and returned to Sheboygan where she lived until her death in 2010.


Around 1940-41 Abe, David and Rose Swerdlow Bensman, and their children, Marvin and Laeh (McHenry), moved to Sheboygan. In 1948 Avram died at their home at 1334 Marie Ct. David Bensman was a newspaper publisher, high school printing teacher during WWII, radio and appliance store owner, record company owner (Polkaland Records) and started WSHE radio (950 kHz) in Sheboygan. He died in 1963, Israel Bensman (printing teacher at Central High School) in 1964, Jean Bensman Horwitz in 1973, and Rose Swerdlow Bensman in 1975.


David had owned and managed the Two Rivers Free Press during his high school years, as well as B&B Sound System. Additional work opportunities took him to Sheboygan, so the family relocated. Izzy was teaching printing at Central High. Abe, Rose Swerdlow Bensman, and their children, Marvin and Laeh (McHenry), moved to Sheboygan around 1945. In 1948 Avram died at their home at 1334 Marie Ct. David Bensman was a newspaper publisher (The Free Press of Two Rivers), high school printing teacher during WWII, as well as an appliance store owner, record company owner (Polkaland Records) and started WSHE radio (950 kHz) in Sheboygan. He died in 1963, Israel Bensman (printing teacher at Central High School) in 1964, Jean Bensman Horwitz in 1973, and Rose Swerdlow Bensman in 1975. Rose Bensman in 2010.

In the summer just before WW2 two sons of Itka Jacov and Jury (the second son) sent their families (the wife and two children –all the brothers) to Belarus to their parents for holidays. They all were killed by the fascists. Jury served in WW2 and was killed. After WW2 Jacob married a widow with son, Olga, and she gave birth to Jacov the daughter Ida. Ida was an economist. She is smart and clever as her mother was. Ida (Greenshtain) has a son Pavel. They had departed to Israel and then to Canada where they live now.

The younger Itka's son Efim served in WW2, did not have a family before the war, but after the war he married a widow with a daughter. She gave birth to two sons: David and Jury and a daughter Rita. 

The second daughter of David and Feiga was Relya (Mazo). People called her Relya de sheiner, she was my grandmother. Relya had two sons:David (my father) and Zalman and a daughter Feiga. As we can see, she continued the name of her parents. Four of her children died in infancy. She became a widow when her eldest son David was nine and her younger son Zalman was one year.

Her brother Meer-Herz tried to help her by taking David in his own family even though his family was very poor. My father said that Meer-Herz*s wife was very kind to him, but in spite of that he returned to his mother in a year. In any case when the cousins lived in Moscow they and their families were friends. In five years she married a very good man – Zalman – Labe Royak (my mother said, that he was very kind man, his stepsons always said «Zalman – Labe-O!». I would like his name to be mentioned. Relya lived in Belarus till 1941, she and husband evacuated to Kirov, were Zalman-Labe died in 1942. After WW2 ended Relya lived in our family not far from Moscow. She died in 1967. The eldest son of Relya ,David, went to Moscow when he was sixteen. In Moscow his uncle Leo (Mazo) and aunt Gesya (Mazo-Lapidus) lived. He began his life as a worker then he graduated from the two Institutes. He was not in WW2 and after the War he lived with his family not far from Moscow in his own house and taught at the Institute in Moscow. He died in 1995. He was 85. David had a daughter Tanya (me) and a grandson Jacov (Ozadovsky) – my son. The daughter of Relya, Feiga came to Moscow too. Here she studied at a medical school and then graduated from the economic Institute just before WW2. She missed her fiancé – he suddenly died. She was devastated and she did not marry and could not work. She was devoted to her mother, brothers and their family and they always supported her. I was her first neice and so I was her favorite.

Zalman was the youngest son of Relya. He also came to Moscow. He did not want to learn but he had golden hands. He worked till WW2. In 1942 he was seriously wounded. For him the war was finished.

After the war he married, has a son Joseph and a daughter Iran. He died at 81. Joseph has daughter Olga and Dmitry – students. Iran and Joseph with his family live in Moscow.



"Our great grandfather David Bensman was highly respected in Lepel both among the Jews as well as the peasants. Devorah told him that the brothers in America sent letters. They sent a photograph of them on horses (has anyone every seen such a photograph?).

Lepel was rich in clay. Our great grandfather owned a brick factory. It appears that the brick factory stayed in the family and was run was Tsodik's grandfather. His grandfather ran it though working with the kiln destroyed his lungs. Tsodik remembers walking the streets of Lepel and being shown all the buildings that were built from "Bensman/Aronin bricks". His grandfather had to stop working in the brick factory and began working in a stable tending the horses. Tsodik believes "it saved our lives". They escaped the Nazis.



Max Bensman was the most elusive of my grandfather's brothers. We only knew that our grandfather had a brother in New York. He was known by various family members as Mosel, Max, Morton. The archival records gave me his Yiddish name (Mota) and recorded that he was the youngest child.

My first step, in 1999, was to obtain Social Security records for all Max Bensmans. I did obtain one that confirmed that he was my great uncle. His records confirms the place of birth and his parents' names. I also now knew his address and place of employment in 1936 and SS#. I also now had his signature which became important later.

Moriah Cemetery in Fairview NJ. It also gave me the funeral home (Swartz Brothers). The death certificate stated that Max was single.





In 1942 Max registered for WWII draft; he was already 59. This document indicates that he was married and her name was Sarah.



A Borukh Bensman was also the grandfather of Valerij Bensman.


This ties Beth to the entire line of Bensmans in Lepel since the 1700's, and possibly to Valerij's family.











The Leyba Bensman Family is being researched by Anna Golod and Lenny Bensman



Eugenyia Bentsman is researching the Joseph Bentsman Family

From Eugenyia -

I was born in Leningrad, U.S.S.R. (today: St. Petersburg, Russia), and my entire family moved to the U.S. in 1982. In fact, you sent the same letter to my father (Alexander Bentsman) in Twinsburg, OH.

Unfortunately, I know more about my grandmother's family, than my grandfather's since he died in 1972 (I was almost 2 years old). His name was Michael Bentsman. He married my grandmother Tsilya Kadaner in 1938. The following is all the information my grandmother could remember. I hope that it is of some help.

My grandfather Michael Bentsman and his family came from Dubrovno.

Parents: Israel and Faina (Fega) Sisters: Mera (Maria) and Bella Brothers: Boris, Yefim, Zahar

Israel died in 1939 of pneumonia. Faina was killed by the Nazis.

Mera moved to Minsk, when she married, and had two daughters. My grandmother cannot recall their names, but one of them, apparently married a scientist. (We don't know Mera's married name)

When we left in 1982, Bella lived in Moscow, and her husband since died (we don't know her married name, either).

Boris died of diabetes around 1978 (he lived well into his 70s). He married a Russian woman, whose maiden name was Borisova. When we left Russia, he had a son and a daughter. They both lived in Leningrad. The son's name is Lev Bentsman and the daughter's name is Julia (Yulia). Lev got a Ph.D., and married. Julia married a Ukrainian man who was an officer in the Soviet Army. I don't know their last name, either.

Yefim was killed in battle during W.W.II. When we left, he had a son who lived in Moscow. I don't know if he stayed in Moscow or moved to Israel but this one would be a Bentsman.

Zahar was killed in 1918.

Michael (my grandfather) had a first cousin in Minsk, who later moved to Leningrad. He was a chief doctor at some clinic. In 1938, he was taken away by the authorities, to a Gulag. He did return very after the war, and died soon thereafter.

Aaron & Margole Shteyingardt Bensman

From Adele:

My grandfather Aaron (Arye Leib) Bensman was born in Lepel in 1879 and died in 1942 in a train during Bensman's family escape from Leningrad siege when the city was encircled by Germans (at least 641,000 people had died in Leningrad during the Siege). Our grandfather was taken form the train and buried in a small village Griasy (Γρязи) in a mass grave.

My grandmother Margolia (Margole, Margola, Margolit) Shteyingardt (Shteingardt) was born in Lepel in 1885 and died in 1964 in Leningrad.

Aaron (Arye Leib) Bensman and Margole Shteyingardt had five children: Guta (1910 - 1998), Zalman (1912 - 1989), Beyle (Bella) (1915 - 2004) – my mother, Isaak (1917 - 1993), Boruch (Boris) (1919 - 1945). Their first child died as a new born.

My grandfather Aaron was very smart and his father wanted him to become a rabbi but it didn't happen. Aaron was involved in a beef trade business. He knew accounting and was considered an educated person. My mother also told me that very shortly after she was born her father was drafted to serve in tsar's army in the First World War. To avoid the army, Aaron cut off his finger and asked a dentist to break all his teeth.

Aaron's father and my great-grandfather Shaya Bensman died at age 92 in Lepel approximately in 1929 - 1928. So he could be born in 1837 - 1838. Shaya died after he fell down from a staircase. His wife's name was Belle (my mom told me that she was named after her). As far as we know their children were: my grandfather Aaron, his brother Joseph (Joshe) and a sister Mariasya (Miriam) who lived in Krasnoluki.

My great-grandfather Shaya was a melamed - he ran a heder. Shaya was arrested and forced to close his school. My mother remembered the scene how her elderly grandfather (he was a very tall and strong man) was walking down the street followed by little boys - his students - and cried. It happened in 1923 -1924. They lived not far from the market (now it is called Volodarskiy street). The Jewish education and tradition that existed for centuries in Russian Empire came to the end. After that it became forbidden and dangerous to practice.

My grandfather's younger brother Joseph (Joshe, Josef) Bensman (1886?), left Lepel in 1912.

Joseph invited his fiancée Hanna by sending her so called "Shift card". She left Lepel in 1915. All three sons were born in New York City (Brooklyn).

My mother told me that they changed the family name from Bensman to Berman (or Benson) upon arrival to New York city. They settled in Brooklyn where Joseph had a paint shop. He died during a fire in his shop in 30th. This is all I know about Joseph's family.

The family moved from Lepel to Leningrad. Guta moved in 1926, my mother in 1929, and the rest of the family moved after Shaya's death. Until the mid 30th my grandfather Aaron Bensman remained in touch with his brother and was receiving money from America until Josef's death. After that the families lost each other.

My grandparents Aaron (Arye Leib) Bensman and Margole Shteyingardt had five children: Guta (1910 - 1998), Zalman(1912 - 1989), Beyle (Bella)(1915 - 2004) – my mother, Isaak (1917 - 1993), Boruch (Boris) (1919 - 1945).

Guta married Konstantin Sukhov in 1936 in Leningrad and they had two children: Eugenia (1937) and Viktor (1940). Konstantin Sukhov became a victim of the Stalin regime. He was arrested in 1940 and killed as an "enemy to the nation".

Guta and Eugenia with her family immigrate to USA in 1991 and now live in New York City.

She is married to Adkady Blyaher and has a son Boris.

Her brother Victor and his family still lives in St.Petersburg.

Victor Sukhov has two daughters; one from his first marriage Lilia Sukhova now lives in Bremen, Germany.

Viktor and his wife Elena have a daughter Ekaterina Sukhova.

Zalman married Anna and they had two daughters: Bronislava (1952) and Larisa (1955).

My both cousins with their families now live in Israel. Bronisla has a son Yuri Ratner who is married to Natalia and has two sons. Larisa has two daughters: Katy Burkies and Marie Beilin. Marie married to Ori Beilin and they have two children, they live in Tel Aviv.

Nobody survived from Isaac's family. His daughter was born in 1948, she tragically died in 1983.

The youngest son Boris Bensman – the most talented and handsome in our Bensman family was killed at the end of the Second World War i(10/03/1945) during liberation of Hungary from German Nazis. He was 26 years old. He is buried at the soviet military cemetery in little town of Enyng. My Mother Bella Bensman moved to Leningrad in1928, after the war she met my father Isaac Grosman and I was born in 1948.

After almost nine years (1979 – 1987) being "refusniks" (my father was considered as a person who had access to the state secrets, that was invented by KGB) my parents and I were given a permission to leave the USSR in 1987 and we immigrated to the United States in 1988 and settled in New York City.

In 1990 I moved to Canada, Ottawa to reunite with my friend Roman Izbinsky with whom we were separated for 13 years. We married in 1990 and in 1997 our daughter Miriam Alyza Izbinsky was born. Later I sponsored my mom Bella, who moved to Canada. My mother Bella Grosman (Bensman) died in Ottawa in 2004.






Avi Bensman is researching Bensmans for Svir

My name: Abraham (Avi) Bensman, 60 year old, married to Judith same age. We live in Netanya, Israel. My parents Issac Bensman 87 yr and my mother Lee Bensman 85 year live in Afula, Israel. My father Issac came to Israel after the holocaust from a shtetle called svir (swirr) in Belarus, south of Lepel.

My name is Albert Bensman and I live in Paris (France). I was born in 1945 in a small village in Belarus called Dunilowicze. It is located 150 Km west of Minsk and 120 Km east of Vilnus. My father Berl Bensman and my grandparents lived also in this village where there was a community of 850 Jews. On 21 November 1942 825 out of the 850 Jews were killed by the Germans. My father and mother were among the few survivors!

The Dov Bensman Family (1850's) is being researched by Dick Aronoff

This family has ties to Lepel, Benshincovichi in Belarus as well as Sheboygan and Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Over the years I have worked with Dick Aronoff (and other family members) to connect our families. We share a common surname. Both families immigrated to the same towns in the United States and at one point lived on the same street in Sheboygan. Family lore always gave the same answer, "distant cousins". 


The Aaron Benzman Family is being researched by Gail Benzman and Barbara Benzman Puglia

From Barbara:

I called my cousin in New York tonight who is a few years older than me and still a Benzman. Her name is Gail. Anyway, she remembers that my grandfather, Benjamin Benzman, came from a small town in Russia and she thinks it could be Lepel. He came to the United States but his two sisters never made it here. There were arrested on a train trying to get out. This would have been late 1800's or early 1900's. His wife brought their first born to America in 1904. Her name was Leah and later shortened to Lee. She then had a brother born in America named Abraham (1905) who was Gail's father and then my father was born (1908), who was Jacob. She remembers that my grandfather was a socialist and that he helped many people who came from Russia by giving them a place to live when they arrived in America. Gail's mother is still alive and living in California in a rest home and she is calling her this weekend to see what else can be remembered.

The Lipa Bensman Family is being researched by Alexander Patashinksi



Lipa Bensman

From Alexander:

My mother was Sofia (a substitute for her Jewish name Sheine-Golde) Bensman, the daughter of Lipa Lelbovich Bensman and Rachel Ruvimimovna Timkina. Liba siblings. About 1960, I met in Moscow his sister Relya. Two of his brothers (Aba and Gersh?) and maybe a sister immigrated to England, probably well before 1912: Lipa spent some time there around 1912 – 1913. In 1913 he visited Russia and got trapped there by the WWI and then by the Bolshevik Revolution of 1917.

My mother told me that Lipa's brother (Gersh?) was a Jewish socialist, co-founder of BUND. My aunt Gita Bensman told me once that in 1930, a relative Arthur (?), an American, financially supported and thus helped our family in Vitebsk (Belarus) to survive the hunger of 1930.

Lipa was born in 1879 in Vitebsk, Lepel, Chashniki or Eserishe (a small village in this part of NE Belarus, all points are within -50 miles from the larger city Vitebsk. His father Leibe (?) belonged to an affluent family but probably got into some troubles with Russian authorities, went to a small village and kept low profile: he married "a proste" (not educated) woman and had 5 daughters (Frieda, Genja, Zipaneche, Relya, Bronya) and 3 sons (Gersh, Abba and Lipa). Gerch and Abba and some of the sisters immigrated from Russia to England well before 1913. I was told that one of the brothers (Gersh or Aba) was a co-founder of BUND (Jewish Socialist Movement). The BUND was considered the worst enemy of Bolsheviks, so it was very wise on his part to escape from Russia before they sized the power.

Lipa got stuck in Russia when he returned for a vaction to help with my Grandman Rachel to heal her rheumatism, and to see his kids (David, Boris, Sofia, Frida, Gita, Iosif). In Russia, they survived the 1917 revolution and were safe until 1937. The kids appeared very able to learn, got educated, and did well: David worked for a central Newspapaer "Trud" (Labor), Boris become known by his studies in Economical sciences, Iosif went to Navy and become an officer.

In 1937, in one of the Stalin's terror waves, Lipa was arrested on charges of speaking out against Stalin and prosecuted as "enemy of the people". He spent 3 years in prison, and then was sent away to Kochenjevo (near Novosibirsk) where he lived under strict surveillance. He was forbidden to appear in larger cities like Novosibirsk. His wife Rachel, and daughters Sonya (a russified form for Shein-Golde), my mother, cam from Vitebsk to Novosibirsk in 1941 escaping from the oncoming Nazi troops.

Lipa was brave enough to violate the rules of exile, and secretly visited with us in Novosibirsk. If caught he could have been imprisoned again or put in a forced labor camp. In one of these visits I took the photo below: this is the only one I have. Family photos have been lost in 1945 when the packs of my aunt Gita was stolen on a train trip. When in exile in Kochenevo, Lipa was not permitted to have a home. He wandered from home to home with a sewing machine that he assmbled form scrap parts, repairing old dresses or making new dresses. In these unbearable living conditions, he still saved some money to help his relatives. As miserable as his life was, my Grandfather cared very much about my future; once I spent some 10 days with Lipa in Kochenevo, and I have not forgotten some of his words. My father Zachar Patashinskii (or Potashinsky) went to the Red army in 1941, and fell in 1944, so when growing up I had no men around me except for Lipa.

In 1951, Lipa lost his special "political enemy" passport. The enforcement officer who had to supervise Lipa offered a normal passport if Lipa would pay him off. This, however, could b provocation, and was extremely dangerous not only for Lipa but for the rest of the family; all relatives of an "enemy of the people" were under suspicion and livedunder high fears. We all could be sent to a concentration camp. My mother, a famous physician, had a high post in a military Hospital before 1937, but kept a low profile and low-paid job after Lipa was arrested. Same happened to her siblings.

The decision (to bribe or not to bribe the officer) was too hard for Lipa. In a short time, he developed stomach cancer. He became terminally ill; my mother took him, illegally, to the hospital where she worked as a physician. He died there. In his last words, he asked that part of the money he left be used to buy a bicycle for me. He had known that I always dreamed of having a bike. My mother saved the rest of the money. This becomes very handy: in 1954 (after Stalin death in 1953), I was successful in passing the admission tests and enrolled in Moscow Institute for Physics Technology. There were no savings in the family to pay for the tickets and first expenses, so this was covered by the money Lipa saved.

After Stalin's death, Lipa was formally exonerated (post-humously); we received an official paper stating that he was not guilty, and my Grandmother received a small sum of money, about the cost of meager food for a week.

In my thoughts, I see my parents, and grand-, and great – grand parents coping with the disasters of Russiaon life, but still remaining optimistic, and doing what they could for the next generations. I'd like to see that strength and endurance in these generations.

Haim Bensman is being researched by Reuven Bensman

From Reuven:

My great grandfather was Haim Bensman of Lepel, Belarus. His children was Shmuel, Avram (Avraham), Cilya, Feigel. His sister and brother immigrated to USA or Canada before 1914, but I don't know they names. Haim Bensman died in Lepel about 1910. My grandfather was Shumeul his son.

Leslie Moser is researching Taube BenzmanWimenitz and her sister

From Leslie Moser:

I am interested in the Benzman name, and stumbled upon your website. I just found some new information on Ancestry.com. They recently added Ellis Island immigration lists. I've seen these lists a million times on the Ellis Island site, but this site shows the lists of people who were detained for some reason or another. On a list for my great Aunt, Taube Wimeritz, it says she was supposed to be picked up by her brother (my great-grandfather, Meyer Wimenitz), but instead was picked up by her sister, Mrs. Benzman (no first name listed) of 60 Govenuer Street. I'm assuming that is NY. Digging a little further, I found out that the Benzman's were from Lepel and Beshenkovitz, like my relatives. I also found out that many people from the Shtels' settled in Sheboyan or Passaic,

NJ. My family was from Passaic.

This is the first time I have ever heard the Benzman name. I know my great-grandfather had a sister named Mary, who I assume is Taube, and a sister named Kalia. She may have been the Rikote who arrived with Taube. I never knew of another sibling, but on the census record for my great-great-grandfather, Nathan Wimenitz, it says that he had 4 children.

To make a long story short, is it possible that one of the Sheboyan Benzmans was my great-grandfather's sister? Other names that come up on my tree are Geiman, Horowitz, and Lurie.

Vera Izrailit is researching Itka Bensman

Leib Bensman, born around 1880 (+-10 years), lived in Senno, married Rakhil Lipkin.

They had children:

Genia, born around 1910, lived mostly in St. Petersburg, died in 1980s, was a secretary or typist, and was married to a guy whose last name was Dvorkin, had two sons:

Iosif Dvorkin, who lives in St. Petersburg with his wife Tatiana (don't remember her last name). They are about 60 y.o. and have a daughter, Anna, who is married and has a kid.

Mikhail Dvorkin, who lives somewhere in Germany with his wife Evgenia and kid(s). He is 55 or so.

Yefim, born around 1914, died around 1980, lived mostly in St. Petersburg.

Grigory, born 1912, used to live in St. Petersburg, now lives in Brookline, MA. Married to Rivka Ilmer (originally from Kublichi, Belarus). Has a daughter:

Dossier on pronouncement of the requisition to Bensman and Nejstat, off-licence owners, for their petition according to the injunction of the Minister of the finances, 1830 (3 pages)

From this dossier follows that Itska Bensman and Nejstat had off-licence in Lepel Town. This off-licence was transferred to the landlord Pakosh, the mortgager, for keeping by Vitebsk Kazyennaya Palata

because of bankruptcy of the owners. In May 1830 Bensman and Nejstat applied with the petition on Lepelsky tax refund to the Minister of the finances.

In 1830 May 31 the Minister of the finances answered that he had presented their petition to the Senate. This official reply of the Minister of the finances was carried to Bensman and Nejstat by the Civil Gubernator

of Vitebsk Province through the Executive Gorodnichy

of Lepel 1830 June 19.

(Perhaps, the application of the Minister of the finances was satisfied by the Senate and Lepelsky tax has been given back to the petitioners. So there is no information about it in this dossier).
